ARTICLES

You can locate journal, magazine, and newspaper articles using databases. These resources cannot commonly be accessed using standard search engines such as Bing, Google, Yahoo, etc.

Databases that you can employ specifically for your program include:

[Academic Search Complete](#) [EBSCO]

- This multidisciplinary database can be used for research on most topics. It includes over 5,000 full-text journals.

[CINAHL Plus with Full Text](#) [EBSCO]

- The Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature (CINAHL) is the primary resource for literature in nursing and allied health. This database indexes over 2,800 journals, with full text coverage for more than 560 titles.

[Psychology and Behavioral Sciences Collection](#) [EBSCO]

- This database provides coverage of nearly 550 full text journals, including more than 500 peer-reviewed titles.

[SocINDEX with Full Text](#) [EBSCO]

- Topics covered by the database include: criminology and criminal justice, ethnic and racial studies, gender studies, marriage and family, rural and urban sociology, social development, social psychology, social structure, social work, substance abuse and other addictions, violence, and much more. Full-text is available for more than 340 journals.
