## PHILIPPINES EQUIVALENT TO ALBERTA HIGH SCHOOL

Student who attended the 10 year curriculum should submit their Post-Secondary transcript from their College or University to support their admission to Medicine Hat College. 10<sup>th</sup> year photocopies may be requested if relevant, but official copies are not required.

Students who graduate from the newer 12<sup>th</sup> year curriculum should submit an academic transcript showing grades and subjects taken. As this curriculum is new, we recommend also including photocopies of your 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> year if they are not included on your academic transcript from your high school.

Documents should be issued directly from the institution attended.

## POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION AND TRANSFER CREDIT

All academic transcripts should come directly to Medicine Hat College from the issuing institution. Please see notes on translation below.

Transfer Credit: Students will receive an email to their [mymhc.ca](mailto:mymhc.ca) email account after receiving admission requiring detailed course outlines. For more information, please email [transfer@mhc.ab.ca](mailto:transfer@mhc.ab.ca). Students from the Philippines who attended a 10 year system may only be eligible for transfer credit from year 3 and 4 of their Post-Secondary education.

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Students from PHILIPPINES require English Language Proficiency. Students who attended a British, Canadian, American or other international school may be exempt from English Language Proficiency but should check if their high school is exempt by emailing [info@mhc.ab.ca](mailto:info@mhc.ab.ca).

We understand that many times, education from the PHILIPPINES has been completed in the English Language but this requirement is important to ensure that students are adequately prepared for studies in Canada.

## ACCEPTABLE ENGLISH TRANSLATIONS (IF TRANSCRIPT NOT ISSUED IN ENGLISH)

Students should always submit their official documents in the official language of issue. If the language of issue is not English, students should provide an acceptable English translation which should

- Be literal word-for-word translations presenting the same order of information and format as the original.
- Not leave any information out, be altered, or have information added. This means that all grades, comments, dates, and discussion must be included.
- Convey the information and format of the original.
- Have an appropriate corresponding original language document on file in the official language via the proper issuing authority.
