Continuation Requirements

- Students must adhere to the professional commitment as outlined in the Therapist Assistant Program Student Handbook. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from the program.
- Students must complete the program within five years of registration in TAPC 110.
- All TAPC, SLPA, KNES, LING and IDST 100 courses must be completed with grades of C or better.
- Students must earn a grade of at least C- in all other courses.
- In order to be able to continue in the program, a current and cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 is required at the end of each semester.
- Attendance in all courses is expected for success in the program
- Students will be permitted to repeat a particular Therapist Assistant course (TAPC, SLPA) only once.
- Students are expected to complete courses in the sequence outlined in the calendar. Revised plans of study must be discussed and developed with the Academic Advisor and approved by the Program Coordinator.
