Program Notes:

Continuation requirements: To be in good standing, you must:

- Achieve a minimum of a C grade in all required courses.
- You may only repeat SLWK and HLSC courses once (this includes withdrawing or failing a class).
- As a student in the Addictions Counselling/Social Work Dual Diplomas Program you are expected to exercise responsible conduct that reflects favourably on you as a developing professional, the program, and Medicine Hat College. Failure to do so could result in your dismissal from the program.
- Questionable performance in relation to harming yourself or others and/or to the maintenance of the professional standards of the program may result in you being asked to leave the program at any time and you may receive a failing grade in any course you are registered in at the time.
- If you have been absent from the program for one calendar year and are returning to complete a course, you will be required to successfully complete a comprehensive evaluation. Depending on the outcomes of the evaluation you may be required to successfully complete remediation in preparation to enter the practicum.
- You should see your Academic Advisor or Program Coordinator if you:
 - Choose to take courses in a different configuration than shown above.
 - Drop or fail a course.
 - Want to take a course in the spring semester or from another institution.

Required Withdrawal

• In addition to the courses required for graduation your progress in the program will be reviewed each semester by the program faculty. Should you be found to be in academic difficulty or should your professional suitability be of concern, you may be referred for remedial assistance or, in extreme cases, asked to withdraw from the program.

Graduation Requirements

- You must achieve a minimum of a C grade in all courses in order to be eligible to graduate.
- You are allowed six years to complete the dual diplomas route.
