Program Notes:

- **Continuation Requirements:** In order to be considered a continuing student of record in the Child and Youth Care Counsellor Program, students must:
 - maintain a minimum of a "C" grade in all Child and Youth Care (CYCC) courses.
 - maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all courses required to complete the program.
 - complete all prerequisite courses before moving on to the next core CYCC courses.
 - Students may repeat courses only at the discretion and with the permission of the Child and Youth Care Counsellor Program Coordinator.

Graduation Requirements

- All courses outlined in the calendar must be completed with an overall GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Student are expected to meet the physical demands of meeting clients in their own life space, and to always maintain healthy, professional boundaries.
- Should the program coordinator judge, in consultation with faculty, that there is evidence that students are professionally unsuitable or a risk to clients, the coordinator may prohibit you from attending or completing a practicum.
- Students that have been absent from the program for one calendar year and are returning to complete a course will be required to successfully complete a comprehensive evaluation. Depending on the outcomes of the evaluation students may be required to successfully complete remediation in preparation to enter the practicum.

You should see your Academic Advisor or Program Coordinator if you:

- Choose to take courses in a different configuration than shown above.
- Drop or fail a course.
- Want to take a course in the spring semester or from another institution.
