- This is not an after-degree program. To be admitted into year three you must meet both program and GPA admission requirements.

- In year three and four, you must choose co-listed courses. Your advisor will send you a list of these co-listed courses after acceptance into the program. To fulfill program requirements, you are required to select your two 3000 level English courses, one 2000 level Humanities Minor, and one 2000 level elective from this list. Please ensure you have not already taken the MHC course equivalents.
- If you would prefer to take a 1000 level elective, please email your Academic Advisor. If you have already fulfilled the senior-level course requirement, you will be granted permission. If not, you will be required to take a 2000 level elective.
- Transfer credit cannot be awarded for any year three or four courses due to residency requirements (a minimum of 60 credits must be taken while enrolled in the 'Mount Royal University Bachelor of Education' program).

## **Graduation Requirements:**

To successfully complete the Mount Royal University and Medicine Hat College Collaborative Bachelor of Education you must:

- Complete the minimum 60 credits of required year three and four courses, including the major practicums.
- Have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 based on all the courses required for graduation.
