Program Notes: Continuation Requirements

- ☐ A minimum grade of C+ is required in each PRNU course, BIOL 152 and PHSL 200
- ☐ You must maintain a C- in all other required courses
- ☐ A CR (Pass) is required in clinical and practicum courses for successful course completion

Students who are transferring from another nursing program and will be entering into a clinical course, will be required to demonstrate competence in the knowledge and skills required for that clinical experience prior to the beginning of the clinical course.

Re-entry to the Program

A student must indicate his/her intent to re-enter in consultation with the Academic Advisor, and the Program Coordinator. Students who have failed to meet the performance requirements of the program are required to indicate re-entry into the program at predetermined dates. For re-entry into a semester, students must confirm with the Academic Advisor six months prior to returning.

Students who have been away for more than one year, and will be entering into a clinical course, will be required to demonstrate competence in the knowledge and skills required for that clinical experience prior to the beginning of the clinical course

Note: Students can only re-enter the PN Program once, and must complete the program, within five (5) years of initial admission. Exceptions may be made in extenuating circumstances with permission of the Dean (or delegate).

You should see your Academic Advisor or Program Coordinator if you:

- Choose to take courses in a different configuration than shown above.
- Drop or fail a course.
- Want to take a course in the spring semester or from another institution.
