Program Notes:**Program Progression**

Students are required to adhere to program policies regarding punctuality, attendance, professional appearance, and responsiveness to supervision and feedback. They must demonstrate the ability to provide safe and competent care at all times.

If a student's performance raises concerns about the safety of client care or failure to meet program standards, they may be removed from the laboratory or clinical setting. Ongoing inability to meet expectations for safe and professional practice may result in dismissal from the program. Successful completion of all required theory courses within a given term is mandatory prior to entering the corresponding clinical placement. This ensures that learners are adequately prepared to meet the expectations and responsibilities of the clinical environment.

In the event that a student is not successful in one or more theory courses during a term, they are encouraged to continue with any remaining term courses for which they are eligible. Credit will be retained for successfully completed courses, and students may re-enter the program at a later date to complete outstanding requirements, subject to program availability and re-entry guidelines.

Graduation Requirements

To successfully graduate from the program and receive an Alberta Health Care Aide certificate, students must:

- Achieve passing grades in all theory, lab, and clinical assessments (70% minimum passing grade for all course exams) Courses are graded as complete or incomplete on your transcripts
- Meet the attendance requirements outlined in the Health Care Aide program Handbook

Failure to meet any of these requirements will result in withdrawal from the program

NOTE: Students who do not achieve a passing grade in a course will be required to repeat it, and must meet with the Department Chair, or designate, or Academic Advisor to determine a progression plan.

Industry Credentials

Medicine Hat College will award a HCA certificate to all learners who successfully complete the Government of Alberta Provincial Curriculum Health Care Aide (HCA) program.

To be eligible to work as a Health Care Aide in Alberta, students are required to:

- Successfully pass the Alberta Health Care Aide Registration Exam (AHRE) and,
- Maintain active membership with their governing body, the College of Licensed Practical Nurses and Health Care Aides of Alberta (CLHA)
