# All health care students must be immunized according to <u>AHS Standards.</u>

Immunizations Recommended for Health Care Students include:

#### **Immunizations**

- Tetanus
- Diphtheria
- Acellular Pertussis
- Polio
- Measles
- Mumps
- Rubella
- Hepatitis B
- Influenza
- Varicella (if needed)

#### **Tests**

- Tuberculin Skin Test (TST, Mantoux, PPD)
- Hepatitis B blood test (if needed, according to Hep B risk Assessment)
- Varicella blood test (if needed)
- Chest x-ray/Tb Clearance letter (if needed)

## **Q:** What documents do I need to submit?

- ✓ AHS Client Immunization Profile (Official Immunization Record)
- ✓ Proof of Influenza/Covid Vaccination (if received)
- ✓ Tb Skin Test result in mm
- ✓ Tb Follow-up documentation (if positive/significant TST)
- ✓ Hep B Serology documentation (if applicable)
- ✓ Varicella Serology documentation (if applicable)

### **Q:** How do I submit my documents?

### Q: What are the first steps in completing these requirements?

- Contact Community Health Services to book an appointment with a Public Health Nurse
  - a) Identify yourself as a Post-Secondary Health Care Student
- 2. Email <u>immunizations@mhc.ab.ca</u> to indicate date of appointment
- 3. Request your immunization history from your provincial public health office and present your record to the Medicine Hat/Brooks public health office for review and verification

**Q:** What is the difference between Community Health Services and Public Health Services?

- ✓ Nothing
- $\checkmark$  They are the same thing

### Q: What if I was not born in Alberta/Canada

- 1. Request your vaccination record from the province/country of origin
- 2. Bring any existing vaccination records to Medicine Hat Community Health Services for review and verification
- 3. Book an appointment with Public Health to have a **Post-Secondary Health Care Student Assessment**

## **Q:** What if I do not have any previous immunization records?

- ✓ Do not worry!
- ✓ Book an appointment with Public Health to have a Post-Secondary Health Care Student Assessment
- $\checkmark$  The public health nurse will instruct you about what vaccines you need

## **Q:** What if no records of immunizations are available from my country of birth?

- ✓ Do not worry!
- ✓ Book an appointment with Public Health after receiving your Alberta Health Card
- ✓ Public Health will offer and provide all required vaccinations

## Q: What happens at my first appointment?

- ✓ At your first appointment with the Public Health Nurse, they will complete a Post-Secondary Health Care Student Assessment
- $\checkmark$  You will be offered any outstanding vaccines
- ✓ The nurse will "plant" the Tuberculosis Skin Test (TST)
- ✓ The nurse will provide you with a lab requisition for Hep B Serology (if you've already had the Hep B vaccine series) and Varicella Serology (if needed)
- ✓ If a positive serology report for Varicella exists in your file, the nurse will provide a copy of that result

## **Q:** What happens at my second appointment?

- ✓ At your second appointment, the Public Health Nurse will "read" your Tuberculosis Skin Test (TST)
  - If positive/significant, the Public Health Nurse will provide a Chest x-ray requisition and a sputum collection kit
- After your second appointment, please request your Client Immunization
  Profile
  - Email your **Client Immunization profile** to: <u>immunizations@mhc.ab.ca</u>

## **Q:** What if my Tb Skin Test is positive (>10mm)?

- ✓ Follow up by Public Health is required
- You will need to provide proper **Tb follow up documentation** from
  Public Health to indicate that you are clear to continue into any clinical course

# **Q:** What is proper follow up documentation after a positive/significant TST?

A:

 ✓ It refers to a "clearance letter" from the Public Health Nurse or treating Physician stating that proper tuberculosis protocols have been completed and you are clear to attend clinical

✓ Please request this letter from the public health nurse if applicable

## Q: How do I get Hepatitis B Serology?

A: If the public health nurse considers that you are eligible for Hep B Serology:

- $\checkmark$  The nurse will provide you with a lab requisition during your appointment
- ✓ Bring the lab requisition and your AB Health care card to the Laboratory Patient Collection Site (44 Carry Drive SE, Medicine Hat) or book an appointment to complete bloodwork
- $\checkmark$  Results can take up to 2 weeks
- ✓ Follow up with public health if you have not received your results in two weeks

## Q: What is Hepatitis B Serology Documentation?

A: Proper documentation means:

 ✓ A letter from public health stating you have immunity (protection) against Hep B

#### **or**

✓ Laboratory result: Antibody to Hep B Surface Antigen (Anti-HBs) positive is greater than or equal to 10 IU/L; negative is less than 10 IU/L

### **Q:** What do I need for Varicella?

A: You need one of the following three options:

- $\checkmark$  2 documented doses of varicella vaccine
- ✓ Strong recollection of chickenpox disease in Canada before 2001 and at older than 1 year of age
- ✓ Laboratory evidence of immunity (positive serology) Documentation

## Q: What is Varicella Serology Documentation?

A: Proper documentation means:

 ✓ A letter from public health stating you have immunity (protection) against Varicella

#### or

✓ Laboratory results: Varicella IgG serology positive / present

### **Q:** How do I complete Varicella serology?

- A: If the public health nurse considers that you are eligible for Varicella serology:
  - $\checkmark$  The nurse will provide you with a lab requisition during your appointment
  - ✓ Bring the lab requisition and your AB Health care card to the Laboratory Patient Collection Site (44 Carry Drive SE, Medicine Hat) or book an appointment to complete bloodwork
  - $\checkmark$  Results can take up to 2 weeks
  - ✓ Follow up with public health if you have not received your results in two weeks

**Q:** I already had a positive Vz result, but I have no records, what can I do?

- ✓ If the public health nurse confirms in your personal file (Netcare) that a positive result exists, they will be able to print a Non-Given Immunization Profile and give it to you
- ✓ Email this document to <u>immunizations@mhc.ab.ca</u>

## **Q:** What if I am from Saskatchewan and I can cannot get the dTap vaccine at 18 years of age?

- ✓ Present your immunizations record to Community Health Services in Medicine Hat
- $\checkmark$  Book an appointment with a public health nurse in Alberta
- ✓ the dTap vaccine at 18 years of age is indicated for all health care students in Alberta
- ✓ the dTap vaccine at 18 years of age is provincially funded in Alberta (this means that it is free for you)

Q: What if I receive my dTap vaccine in grade 9, do I need it at 18 years again? Or is it recommended every 10 years?

A: According to Alberta Standards:

• If no documented history of one dose of acellular pertussis vaccine as an adult, all health care students should receive 1 dose of dTap regardless of the interval since the last dose of tetanus containing vaccine.

# **Q:** How do I obtain my Influenza vaccine in the Spring/Summer?

- Please wait until the Fall/Flu season. Influenza vaccine will be available at that time.
- Book an appointment, or walk-in to a clinic/pharmacy offering these services.
- Email proof of your influenza vaccination to <u>immunizations@mhc.ab.ca</u>

## **Q:** What do I do with my Client Immunization Profile?

- 1. Email to <u>immunizations@mhc.ab.ca</u> after your initial appointment
- 2. Request an updated Immunization Profile from the Public Health Nurse after each appointment
- 3. Email documentation to <u>immunizations@mhc.ab.ca</u> after each subsequent appointment
- 4. Remember to keep a copy for your personal records!!
